Tests

You will be informed about the date of a test at least a week in advance.

Short tests

You will write short tests regularly with the aim to check your process of learning and my process of teaching. Short tests cannot be retaken.

Homework assignments

You may be given homework assignments. Some of which will be obligatory, other may be voluntary.

Mock examination

Mock exam will be held once a term (most likely in December or January and then in May or in June). Mock exams cannot be retaken.

Internal assessment- exploration

If you supply your first draft during the green period you will receive full help and feedback. The green period ends in September IB2. If you do not provide the draft in the green period, the situation is reported to the homeroom teacher and parents via librus.

You are expected to supply the final version of your exploration in one month after obtaining a feedback from your teacher.

The red period starts 15th JANUARY of IB2. If you do not supply your work till this date I have to report missing the deadline to homeroom teacher, student, parents and IBDP coordinartor via librus.

- i. The homeroom teachers sets the meeting of student, parents and IBDPC.
- ii. During the meeting the situation is discussed. Normally, unless there are special health circumstances, the student gets an ultimatum of 7 working days in order to deliver the delayed work. If no part of the work has been previously delivered to the teacher, the student is obliged to write it at school on the school computer, which the teacher has access to. After that time the most advanced version of the work is accepted. In case of not delivering anything the work will not be submitted.
- iii. The proper submitting of the work requires the form and the platform demanded by the teacher. Teacher must confirm that their received the work without that the work is deemed undelivered. It is the responsibility of the student to make sure that the work was delivered properly.

If you supply your exploration during the red period you do not receive any feedback and it is possible that your teacher will not be able to check your work.

The end of the term grade will be calculated as the weighted mean of your grades you will get during the term and grade will be awarded as follows:
