# 1. Marking criteria:

## Grades during the term you will get for

•	Tests	Weight 4
•	Short tests	Weight 1
•	Homework assessments / class activity	Weight 1
•	Mock examination (at least once a year)	Weight 4

All grades will be in percentage.

#### Tests

You will be informed about the date of a test at least a week in advance.

The teacher organizes 2 test dates.

The test grade has a weight of 4. The second test date gives you the opportunity to improve your grade. The new grade has a weight of 4 and the previous one gets a weight of 1.

A student who is absent on both test dates must take the test on an additional date (often at the end of the semester).

Specific health-related absences will be resolved individually.

# **Short tests**

You will write short tests with the aim of checking your process of learning and my process of teaching. Short tests cannot be retaken.

### **Mock examination**

The mock exam will be held at least once a year. The exam will consist of 1 or 2 parts. Each part is graded and weighted 4. Mock exams cannot be repeated.

#### Internal assessment- exploration

If you supply your first draft during the green period, you will receive full help and feedback. The green period ends **October 1**<sup>st</sup> of IB2. If you do not provide the draft in the green period, the situation is reported to the homeroom teacher and parents via librus.

You are expected to supply the final version of your exploration in one month after obtaining feedback from your teacher.

The red period starts **January 15**<sup>th</sup> of IB2. If you do not supply your work till this date I have to report missing the deadline to homeroom teacher, student, parents and IBDP coordinartor via librus and following apply:

- 1) The homeroom teachers set the meeting of student, parents and IBDPC.
- 2) During the meeting the situation is discussed. Normally, unless there are special health circumstances, the student gets an ultimatum of 7 working days in order to deliver the delayed work. If no part of the work has been previously delivered to the teacher, the student is obliged to write it at school on the school computer, which the teacher has access to. After that time the most advanced version of the work is accepted. In case of not delivering any work will not be submitted.
- 3) The proper submitting of the work requires the form, and the platform demanded by the teacher. Teacher must confirm that their received the work without that the work is deemed undelivered. It is the responsibility of the student to make sure that the work was delivered properly.

If you supply your exploration during the red period, you do not receive any feedback, and it is possible that your teacher will not be able to check your work.

The end of the term grade will be calculated as the weighted mean of your grades you will get during the term. The percentage will be changed into grade given in the 1-7 scale. The grade will be awarded as follows:

#### 2. Final grade:

The end of the year grade will be calculated as the weighted mean of your grades you will get during the year.

#### 3. Late arrivals:

- a. Late arrivals for classes are only up to 15 minutes, after that the student is considered absent
- b. If the student is late for attendance check, he/ she has 1 week to inform the teacher via school's online register (librus) that his/her absence should be corrected. Otherwise, the absence remains.

### 4. Grade predictions:

- a. Predicted grades for University based on all the grades that student obtained during the course (including first year and 2nd year up to the moment when the grade is awarded).
- b. Predicted grade for university admissions may be increased by 1 (it is not obligatory), if the student supplied the first draft of her/his Internal Assessment before the time when the predicted grade is awarded.

### 5. For the University purpose

# 6. Final predicted grade

Students will not be informed about teacher's prediction uploaded as "final predicted grade".
